Thirteen UCI faculty members are part of the Highly Cited Researchers list for 2022. Both quantitative and qualitative analyses are used to identify individuals from across the globe who have demonstrated significant and broad influence in their chosen field or fields of research. The preliminary list of Highly Cited Researchers is drawn from the papers that rank in the top 1 percent by citations for field and

publication year in the Web of Science citation index over the past decade. The methodology that determines the "who's who" of influential researchers draws on the data and analyses performed by bibliometric experts and data scientists at Clarivate's Institute for Scientific Information.

This year's 7,225 Highly Cited Researcher designations have been issued to 6,938 scholars. The number of awards exceeds the number of unique individuals because some researchers were recognized in more than one field.
