Responsibilities, Rights, & Remedies

Sexual Discrimination, Sexual Misconduct and Sexual Assault

Title IX

Gives everyone the right to equality in education and employment.

No sexual harassment. No sex discrimination.

Everyone has the right to be free from discrimination, unlawful harassment, sexual misconduct and violence. Students and employees are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that does not infringe upon the rights of others.

Confidentiality

An individual who wishes for the details of an incident to remain completely confidential may speak with certain University officials who, must maintain confidentiality and may not disclose the details of an incident, except as authorized by the individual or required by law. These officials include: the Victim Advocate at CARE, Campus Social Workers, the Ombudsman, and the Counseling Center. Additionally, individuals may make a report to UCIPD and request to be treated as a "confidential victim."

Your Rights

No matter who you are or where or when it happened, if someone sexually assaults you, sexually threatens you or discriminates against you because of your gender, you have **the right** to get help and you have **the right** to continue your education and your work.

Discrimination includes sexual harassment:

A. Unwelcome sexual advances or contact B. Gender stereotyping C. Pressure for sexual favors D. Relationship violence E. Date rape F. Nonconsensual intercourse

G. Sexual assault
